

Spring Renewal

For many of us, springtime is "the most wonderful time of the year," as new life bursts forth from the ground after an

often cold and dreary winter. All around us trees are budding or blooming and early spring flowers are granting our eyes some lovely sights and our noses a wonderful aroma. Everything is turning green as new life arises from the dead of winter.

With these signs of renewal in the physical world around us, it behooves us to consider how we might be renewed spiritually, as individuals and as a church. *The mission study committee is asking for*



your input on how St. Andrew's might be renewed as it looks in this period of pastoral transition to the future God has for the congregation. With the time nearing for the submission of the congregational surveys, the next step will be to tabulate the results, which the committee hopes to have done by the end of April. That will help the committee and the church as a whole to have a better idea of how the church's programs are meeting the needs and interests of church members and others who attend and will fulfill part of the mission study focus of seeking to understand the church's sense of identity, of who St. Andrew's church is and how it can presently be described.

The next step will be to consider the context of the congregation, the people who live and work around the church building, the people to whom St. Andrew's is trying to reach out with the gospel. Who is our neighbor and how closely are we connecting with them? There are groups that specialize in obtaining the demographic information that we need and the one contracted by the presbytery is Percept. Here are some quick basic facts from Percept about the 19713 zip code area in which St. Andrew's is located:

- The current population of the 19713 zip code is 30,651, which is expected to grow by 2% in the next five years.
- The largest lifestyles group is "young and coming," compared nationally to "middle American families."
- The fastest growing racial/ethnic group is Asians, compared nationally with Hispanic/Latinos.
- Households with no faith involvement are a bit higher here, 37%, compared to the national average of 35%.
- The average household income is also higher, \$77,224, compared to the national average of \$66,670.
- There are more single parent households here, 40%, compared to the national average of 30%.
- There are also more college graduates, 30%, compared to the national average of 24%.

We need to try to envision how we will reach out to those around us, for in comparing ourselves to our context, we can then better understand what God might be calling us to be in the future, which is the third focus of the mission study process. We will begin that process on Sunday, May 21 after worship, when Rev. Otto will facilitate the first of two or three reflection sessions, which will last no longer than one hour, when you will have opportunity to discuss in small groups in the fellowship hall some of the issues raised by a comparison of the church's present identity as provided by the surveys with the church's context as provided by the demographic info. Rev. Otto will have PowerPoints to make this as interesting as possible and there will be a member of the mission study committee at each table to help everyone understand and enable everyone to share whatever they might wish in that small group. We need your input! Childcare will be provided. Please plan to stay for an hour after worship on May 21 as we begin these sessions.

The Baby Bottle Boomerang fundraiser for A Door of Hope Pregnancy Center will be held this year from Sunday, April 30 to Sunday, May 28. This is a major source of funding for A Door of Hope, which provides pregnancy testing (including ultrasounds), counseling, and support to women who are unsure of what to do in an unexpected pregnancy. Hope classes provide expectant moms with all they need to know during each step of the pregnancy process as well as what to do in the first three years following the birth of their babies. Abstinence education is provided in local schools and abortion recovery assistance to those who need emotional support following an abortion. Most importantly, all of these services are provided *free of charge* by well-trained support staff who have as their guiding principles the love of Jesus Christ and the desire to share the gospel with those who are struggling during these pivotal periods in life. 


DOLLARS AND SENSE - THE BOTTOM LINE

In February, St. Andrew's received \$12,392.20. That amount is \$715.80 less than the income budgeted for the month. Budgeted monthly income in 2017 is \$13,108. We spent \$13,712.57 in March, which is \$484.78 less than the budgeted expenses of \$14,197.35. The deficit for the month was \$1,320.37. The deficit for the year is \$4,143.91.

In 2016 St. Andrew's received \$157,364.56 and spent \$160,339.08 resulting in a deficit of \$2,974.52.

MENTOR REQUIREMENTS:

- Ages 20 and up
- Able to engage with mentee for a minimum of 4 hours a month
- Provide consistent and positive guidance
- Be a thoughtful, caring and responsible role model
- Ability to pass background check
- Participation in orientation and training
- Commitment to one year participation

MENTEE REQUIREMENTS:

- Selected youth between the ages of 14 and 17
- Youth residing along the route 40 corridor –Bear/Newark
- Residing in single parent household
- Interested in participating in a mentor-mentee relationship
- Able to engage with mentor for a minimum of 4 hours a month
- Commitment to one year participation
- Program youth cannot be involved with the juvenile justice system
