
DOLLARS AND SENSE - THE BOTTOM LINE

In April, St. Andrew's received \$11,549.80. That amount is \$2,463.53 less than the income budgeted for the month. Budgeted monthly income in 2016 is \$14,013.32. We spent \$14,050.04 in April, which is \$53.90 more than was budgeted for the same period. This has resulted in a deficit for the month of \$2,500.24.

Year to date, St. Andrew's has received \$50,991.39 and spent \$57,799.30 resulting in a deficit of \$6,708.91.

Steve Brundage, Moderator

Steve Brundage opened with prayer.

Elders gathered to ask questions concerning interviewing interim pastor candidates, interaction with Presbytery, guidelines for interview questions, timelines.

- Where are we in process?
 Interviewed Randy Otto as prospective candidate. Received his PIF, Statement of Faith and references. Elders present at interview were pleased with interview. Wish to go forward with process. Steve suggests we follow Presbytery criteria: check references, salary requirements, reason for leaving Greenhill. Get permission from Randy to contact Greenhill for reference information.
- Discussed fact that Presbytery asks that we interview other candidates. To date, Rev. Otto was only one that responded and interviewed.
- Mary Ann Colbert expressed concern that Presbytery was taking too much time to react and is expecting Session to interview prospects that have not applied. Steve suggested that we keep going with our search as we have, fulfilling all requirements and "Don't worry about the A.B.C.D letter from Presbytery".
 - Questions for references discussed and agreed upon by Session members (to be used in interviews with Randy Otto and any future candidates.)

 - 2. What impressed you most about candidate?
 - 3. Leadership qualities shown in your relationship with candidate
 - 4. Anything else you'd like us to know about candidate.

Steve suggested actions to appease Presbytery in our search for interim:

- Advertise get the word out of our need
- Challenge Presbytery for other candidates
- Do due diligence for any candidate we feel would fit our need
- Present all benefits, salary package expectations to candidate

After all processes are fulfilled and we wish to offer position to Randy Otto, C.O.M. must approve. If they do not, what is our recourse?

Concerns raised that Presbytery suggestion that St. Andrews explore "other ways of operating" before we make our choice of Interim Pastor. Steve noted that we shouldn't rush for replacement by June 30 deadline.


